## **PLEDGE CAMPAIGN**

We are currently blessed with \$1,710 in Monthly Pledges from 6 Monthly Donors. Thank you, God!

Our current total level of monthly spending for the Education, Food, and Administrative Programs is \$2,750. This will increase to \$3,250 when we hire a full-time Microloan Manager and restart that program. Nanci and I use our Social Security payments to completely cover Administrative/Overhead expenses, with what's left going into the other programs.

You've seen what, with your help, we've been able to do here. This year, we're supporting and assisting 39 children in school, and more than 50 people a week come to The Bridge for food. We're about \$1,000 a month in expenses to be covered by unpledged donations. From time to time, we get individual donations that help make up the difference. We also have suppliers who know what we do and who are willing to wait for payment.


